Orientation

Primary Preceptor: Shantel Mullin, PharmD

Site Description: The Department of Pharmacy Services provides services to 4 hospitals, 3 infusion services, 12 community clinics, 15 retail pharmacy facilities, and specialized ambulatory clinics. The Department is supported by a comprehensive Drug Information Service. As a vibrant, dynamic department, there are many opportunities for projects for a HSPA resident.

Rotation Description: The resident will participate in the orientation schedule for residents. During this time the resident will understand the department organizational structure and the functions of the department. The resident will be oriented to the department operations and computer systems. The resident will be scheduled to partner with unit based and centralized pharmacists. At the end of orientation the resident will be expected to function independently in several practice assignments.
