The University of Utah Health Care Thrombosis Service will host the first Biennial Western Regional Thrombosis Symposium and Working Group Session in 2010. The purpose of this one and a half-day scientific and academic medical conference is to foster consensus building and collaboration among multidisciplinary Western Regional leaders, and to encourage scientific discovery and medical education with regard to thrombosis diagnosis, treatment, and prevention in both clinical and research practices and health professional and public education and outreach.

To this end, the Symposium is designed to provide the most up-to-date information to assist with the implementation of evidence-based management strategies for patients with venous and arterial thrombotic diseases, such as deep vein thrombosis (DVT), pulmonary embolism (PE), myocardial infarction, peripheral arterial disease, and stroke. **The target audience includes community and hospital-based physicians, basic and translational scientists, pharmacists, physician assistants, nurses, administrators, and allied health professionals from throughout the Western Regional United States.**

State-of-the-art interactive presentations, panel discussions, and "Breakfast With the Experts," will provide numerous opportunities for attendees to discuss real patient cases with leaders in the field, network with colleagues, and gain knowledge that can impact practice strategies.
