

## Referral of patient who has a UHC\* **Community Clinic\*\*** provider

### Refer patient to: **REDWOOD ANTICOAGULATION CLINIC**

Steps to make a referral:

1. Call Redwood Anticoagulation Clinic at **213-9150** and
2. Fax referral form to: **213-9160**
3. You are responsible for managing your patient's anticoagulation until the clinic can assume care
4. Do not send a patient home with a follow-up plan that has not been verbally confirmed in person with the clinic – this could lead to an interruption in patient care

#### **If making a referral after hours (Monday to Friday 5 PM – 9 AM, weekends, or holidays):**

1. Call the clinic the next business day and manage the patient's anticoagulation until you have verbally confirmed a follow-up plan with the clinic
2. For urgent referrals, page the person on call for the clinic: **213-9150**

### **REDWOOD ANTICOAGULATION CLINIC INFORMATION:**

- If a patient is referred to a community clinic provider so their warfarin can be managed by Redwood Anticoagulation Clinic, the patient needs to understand that they are completely changing PCPs – this referral is not just for a one time pcp visit so the patient can have their warfarin managed by the clinic
- The patient will need to have an appointment scheduled with the community clinic provider before being referred to the Anticoagulation Clinic
- Patients have an initial in-person appointment for education with the Anticoagulation Clinic and then most patients are telemanaged
- Located within Redwood Community Clinic at 1525 West 2100 South, SLC, 213-9150
