## Rules

- To participate children must fall into one of the two age divisions: K-3rd grade or 4th-8th grade
- The poster must show at least 3 of the **Sun Safe Action Steps**:

Do not burn • Don't use tanning beds • Generously apply sunscreen SPF 30+ • Wear protective clothing such as a hat, sunglasses and swim shirts • Seek shade • Use extra caution near water, snow and sand • Get Vitamin D safely

- No trademarked/copyrighted characters or materials may be used

## Posters Will Be Judged On:

- Ability to show at least three **Sun Safe Action Steps** (as opposed to using only words)
- Creativity
- Originality
- Quality of artwork
- Correct spelling and grammar must be used in the 4th-8th grade category

## Prizes:

- Three finalists will be announced for each grade (K-8th grade) on April 21, 2017
- These finalists from each grade will be invited to an awards ceremony on May 9, 2017 where the winners will be announced
- Winners of each age division (K-3rd and 4th-8th) will win **a new bike**, a pizza party for their class and their winning drawing featured on a billboard in the Salt Lake Valley, educating Utahns on sun safety for the summer months
